Golden weeks can be achieved each week for either achieving targets or effort.


Every 5 golden weeks, your child will earn a reading themed prize.

A 'Reader of the Week' will also be chosen.


Reading VIPERS

At VPJS, we use 'Reading VIPERS' to help children recognise the different reading skills.


Information about the VIPERS and examples of questions to ask your child at home can be found at the front of the reading records.

For the 'Reading Review' week, your child must record what they have read 5 times.


E.g. 01.09 Charlotte's Web Pages 1-17
